Discussion Questions

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1.	Jesus knew that Judas would betray Him, but the disciples did not see it coming. How does this serve as a warning to all of us? (see John 6.70-71; 13.21-30.)
2.	How can people live so "close" to Jesus and not know Him?
3.	When Jesus is threatened, Peter fights. How does Jesus respond? (vv. 10-11)
4.	How did Peter misunderstand Jesus' mission? How do we?
5.	When Jesus is on trial, Peter denies that he is a disciple. When have we denied that we are Jesus' disciples?
6.	How does John show us that Jesus is in control even as He is arrested?
7.	What is Jesus' main concern in this passage? (vv. 8-9)
8.	How should we respond to God's warnings and grace in this passage?
